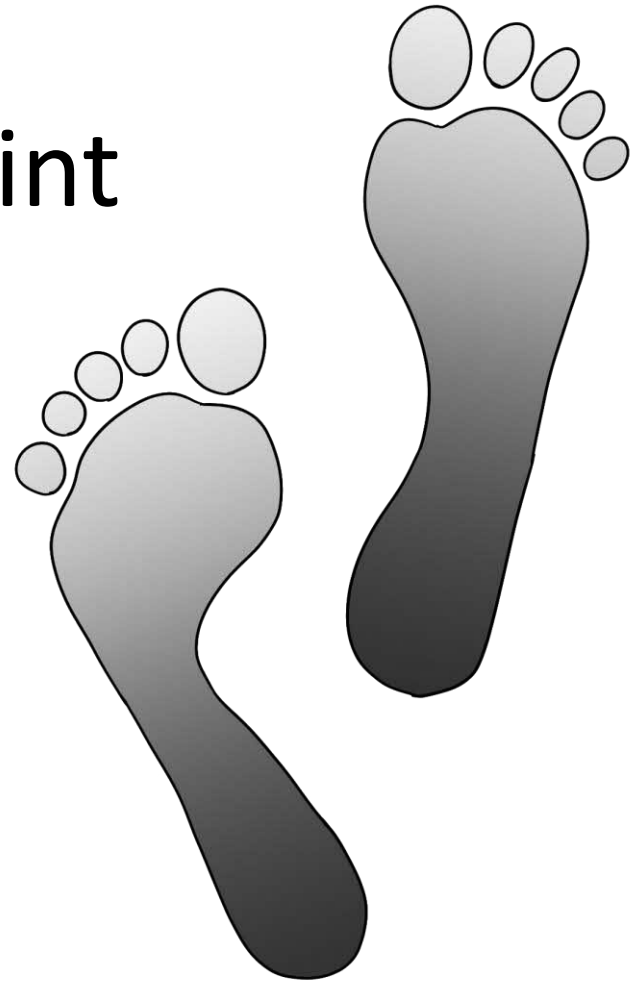


Your Digital Footprint

What is “Personal Information”?



Personal information is any information that can identify you, such as your: name, address, date of birth, telephone number, school name, family member names, and profile picture.

What information should you not easily give to other people? What information is okay to give to other people? Let's think about it.



What information should you not easily give to people online?

Personal Information

1. Name

What information is okay to give to people online?

1. Hobbies
2. Things you are interested in
3. Favorite actors
4. Name of your pet
5. Artwork that you have created

What information should you not easily share with others? What information is okay to share?

Information that should not be easily shared

- Information that can identify you (name, address, etc.)
- Insults or actions that cause trouble for someone

Information that is okay to share

- **Information that cannot identify you** because it is in common with many people (hobbies, favorite things, type of pets that you own, etc.)
