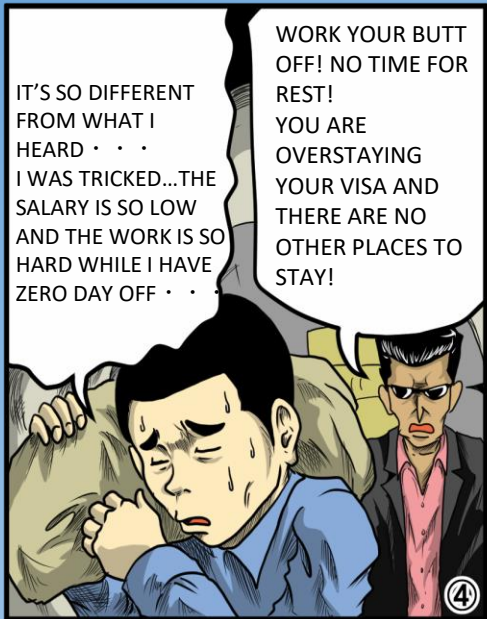
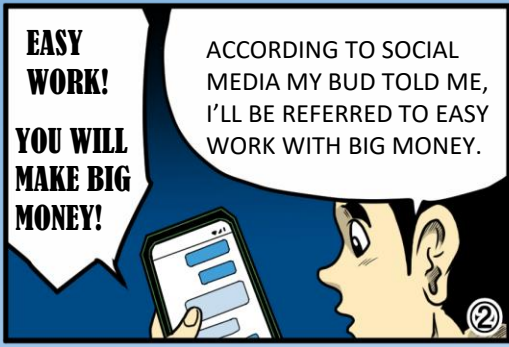


# Not to fall for alluring words

I CAME TO JAPAN FOR TECHNICAL TRAINING, BUT I ONLY DO MANUAL LABOR. IT'S QUITE HARD.



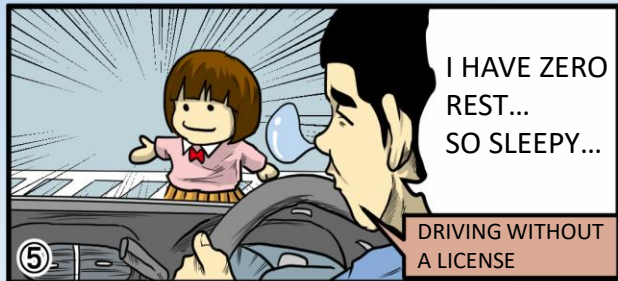

**If you run away from your workplace,**

- there is a risk that you will end up working on a low salary or working for nothing.
- You may have to pay high medical care cost when you are ill or injured since you have no insurance.
- There is a danger that you could be pulled into criminal activities or become a crime victim because of your disadvantage as a run-away trainee.

If you work at any other place than the designated training site, you are “engaging in activity other than that permitted under your resident status” and you are subject to a deportation order. You can be imprisoned for not more than 3 years or fined not more than 3 million yen.

An employer can be charged for “promotion of illegal employment” if he/she has a trainee work, knowing that he/she is a run-away, without arranging any proper legal procedures.
